REACH Announces New Chief Executive Officer

Nonprofit Housing Developer Welcomes Chicago Leader to Portland

PORTLAND, Ore. – March 18, 2013—The Board of Directors of [REACH Community Development](#) today announced the selection of Daniel Valliere as REACH's new Chief Executive Officer.

Dan will begin his tenure at REACH on May 9th. He currently serves as the Executive Director for [Chicago Commons](#), a 100+ year old organization providing educational and social services that help strengthen families and build communities. Dan has more than 20 years of experience in the nonprofit sector, bringing a broad array of organizational development, strategic planning, and leadership skills to REACH.

"The board and staff are very excited to welcome Dan as REACH's new CEO," says Board Chair Ruth Ann Tsukuda. "We look forward to his leadership as we continue to grow and develop as a vibrant resource in the affordable housing community."

While at Chicago Commons, which has a \$20 million annual budget and 600 employees, Dan led a strategic turnaround. He also spearheaded the creation of the [Back Office Cooperative](#), a consortium of Chicago non-profits that consolidated administrative services and achieved significant cost-savings. Dan holds a Masters of Public Affairs from the University of Texas and an Executive Leadership Certificate from Loyola University. He has served on the boards of directors of Near North Health Services and the West Humboldt Park Community Development Council and is a member of The Economic Club of Chicago.
